Re: Village at Laguna Hills - Merlone Geier Response to April 21, 2021 Letter from the Kennedy Commission and Other Organizations

Dear Mayor Pezold and Laguna Hills City Council:

The April 21, 2021 comment letter from the Kennedy Commission and other organizations (collectively referred to hereafter as the "Kennedy Commission") includes certain mischaracterizations of the modifications to the Five Lagunas Project referred to as the Village at Laguna Hills ("VLH"). Fundamentally, the Kennedy Commission overlooks the fact that VLH is a modification of previously-approved project which proposes to add 512 residential units -- 39% of which will be restricted as affordable units -- to 988 units that were previously approved without any affordability restrictions. The Kennedy Commission also fails to recognize that by increasing office use compared to retail and restaurant uses, the VLH modifications will result in a greater proportion of office jobs that pay relatively higher wages compared to Five Lagunas; thus, VLH improves upon any purported imbalance between jobs and housing generated by the project. Specific responses to comments from the Kennedy Commission follow.

1. <u>Kennedy Commission comment: Most the of the jobs created by VLH will not qualify</u> these employees for low- or moderate-income housing.

Response: As described above, VLH is a modification of Five Lagunas. Five Lagunas included 880,539 square feet of retail, restaurant, cinema and health club uses. VLH proposes to reduce those same uses to 250,000 square feet. Whereas Five Lagunas included only 45,890 square feet of flex medical office space, VLH proposes 465,000 square feet of general office use. Thus, VLH proposes a balance of uses that will result in a greater proportion of office jobs to retail, restaurant, cinema and health club jobs compared to Five Lagunas. The Kennedy Commission's comment that the "Village Fiscal Impact Analysis shows 2,900 on-site jobs will be created for 250,000 square feet of restaurants, hotel, and retail . . ." is incorrect, as it ignores the office component. Indeed, fewer than half of the jobs generated by VLH would be restaurant, retail or hotel jobs (1,351), and even this number is a grand total that does not deduct existing restaurant square footage (23,000 sf) or account for the uses (and associated jobs) for the approved Five Lagunas Project.

2. Kennedy Commission comment: While the Addendum to the City of Laguna Hills General Plan Update EIR for the Village at Laguna Hills Project points out that the project creates a 1.87 jobs per dwelling unit ratio, which is lower than the 2030 forecast, the Addendum EIR failed to consider the low-wage nature of the jobs that will be created and the lack of affordability of the dwelling units proposed. A significant portion of the jobs created by the Village at Laguna Hills Project will result in an increase in very-low-income households in

Laguna Hills, yet the Project does not provide a single unit of housing affordable to a very-low-income household. Since most of these low-wage employees will not be able to afford the units, the Project does not really benefit from the alleviated commuter traffic as is normally associated with mixed-use commercial and residential developments and as claimed in the Addendum EIR.

Response: The Kennedy Commission claims that VLH will exacerbate the need for low and very-low income housing in Laguna Hills by creating new low-paying jobs without commensurate housing. Even if it is assumed that VLH will bring new residents to Laguna Hills seeking out retail, restaurant, cinema or health club jobs, VLH is reducing those types of uses by over 600,000 square feet compared to the approved Five Lagunas Project. Moreover, Five Lagunas included no low or moderate-income housing units, so VLH improves the ratio of affordable housing to new, retail, restaurant, cinema and health club jobs.

The Kennedy Commission letter appears to assume only one worker per household to make its claim that providing lower-wage jobs actually harms lower-wage workers. In fact, many households include more than one worker (see below) and housing affordability is based on household income. It should also be noted that according to the Kennedy Commission letter, the City lost 8.7% of its jobs between 2007 and 2017; providing new jobs at a range of salary levels creates more opportunities for Laguna Hills residents.

The Fifth Addendum to the 2009 General Plan EIR ("Addendum") accounts for the fact that VLH proposes modifications to the previously-approved Five Lagunas Project. As required by law, the Addendum evaluates VLH pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15162 and substantiates the determination that VLH will not result in any new or more severe significant environmental impacts. Potential traffic-related impacts were evaluated as part of the Addendum consistent with the City of Laguna Hills Vehicle Miles Travelled Analysis Guidelines under the California Environmental Quality Act. VLH meets two of the City's screening criteria, and as a result, VLH is deemed to not result in significant impacts due to vehicle miles travelled, which is the governing standard under which traffic impacts are evaluated under CEQA. (See Addendum, § 3.16.) Moreover, and although not required by CEQA, the Addendum includes a level-of-service based Traffic Impact Analysis (Appendix G), which documents that VLH will result in a net decrease of 9,970 daily weekday trips compared to Five Lagunas; thus, the Kennedy Commission's claim that VLH "does not really benefit from the alleviated commuter traffic" is incorrect.

3. Kennedy Commission comment: It is also important to remember that nearly one fourth (23%) of already existing Laguna Hills households earn less than \$50,000/year; the proposed low/moderate income units will not be financially available for these current residents either.

Response: The Kennedy Commission argues that 23% of Laguna Hills' existing population does not generate the income necessary to rent low- or moderate-income units. The 2019 Southern California Association of Governments ("SCAG") data cited by the Kennedy Commission describes percentages of household income in broad ranges (e.g., between \$50,000 -\$74,999 and between \$100,000 - \$149,000) that do not directly

correlate to State income limits for affordable housing. As such, a direct comparison between the SCAG data and the State income limits is not possible.

According to SCAG's 2019 Laguna Hills Profile¹, 18% of all households in Laguna Hills are comprised of a single person. Single-person households earning less than \$50,000 per year would, in fact, be eligible for housing at the low income level. Per State income limits, single-person households in Orange County with an annual income of between \$44,851 - \$71,750 qualify for low-income housing. (https://www.hcd.ca.gov/grants-funding/income-limits/state-and-federal-income-limits/docs/income-limits-2020.pdf) Larger households earning less than \$50,000 per year would not fall within the income ranges for low-income units and would need very low income units, which are now included in the RHNA goals for Laguna Hills.

The Kennedy Commission also does not take into account that there has been almost no new housing development within the City of Laguna Hills in recent years, whether market rate or affordable. The 2019 SCAG Laguna Hills Profile shows that in 2018, the City issued only a single building permit for new housing. Approving VLH enables the City to make substantial progress toward satisfying its Regional Housing Needs Allocation ("RHNA") requirements for total housing and for low- and moderate-income housing. And as the Kennedy Commission notes, VLH will be the first project in the last 40 years (including Five Lagunas), to include affordable housing requirements.

4. Kennedy Commission comment: With over 2900 on-site employees and without providing adequate housing affordable at these income levels, this project will have a significant environmental impact on the community by creating an even greater strain on the limited supply of housing available in Laguna Hills at these income levels and on traffic as well.

Response: The Kennedy Commission reiterates the comment that VLH will result in environmental impacts by creating new jobs. As discussed above, VLH reduces what the Kennedy Commission claims are land use types that generate lower-paying jobs in favor of higher-paying office jobs compared to the approved Five Lagunas Project. Moreover, VLH will result in as many as 1,500 new units of housing, including 200 low and moderate-income units, which will substantially increase the City's housing stock. The Addendum evaluates VLH pursuant to CEQA and establishes that VLH will not result in any new or more severe significant environmental impacts, including with respect to population and housing (§3.13), public services (§3.14) and recreation (§3.15.) And as further described above, VLH will not result in significant traffic impacts in the form of vehicle miles travelled (§3.16) and will reduce weekday traffic compared to Five Lagunas.

5. <u>Kennedy Commission comment: As proposed, this development would yield only 100 low-income housing units. This is only 11% of the required 917 of the homes identified by RHNA in the 6th Cycle Housing Element allocated to very-low and low-income earners over the next 8-year period.</u>

<u>Response</u>: The Kennedy Commission ignores the fact that VLH is a modification of the Five Lagunas Project, and Five Lagunas does not include any affordable units. To be clear, were it not for VLH, the property owner would be permitted to redevelop the site

without *any* affordable units. VLH does not include very low income units, but represents over 28% of the City's 2021-2029 RHNA allocation for low-income housing and 28% of its allocation for moderate-income housing, all as part of a single project and on a site that would otherwise be devoid of any affordable units.

6. Kennedy Commission comment: Once the current Village site plan is approved, the site will no longer qualify as "available land" for inclusion in the site inventory for the 6th Cycle Housing Element. Without that large site available for inclusion, it will likely put even more pressure on the City to find enough suitable land to satisfy the new, higher RHNA requirements in the new 6th Cycle Housing Element.

Response: The City is aware that once VLH is approved, it will be treated as "approved, permitted development" rather than "available land" in the Sixth Cycle Housing Element. The City is also aware of the rule that sufficient land elsewhere must be identified in its Housing Element to accommodate all RHNA housing units not accounted for by the VLH approvals. The pressure on the City to meet this requirement is an existing condition and is not caused by VLH approvals, which will provide 200 more affordable units than are required under existing development approvals for the project site.

Good evening, members of the City Council. I am Denise Fleury, with Welcoming Neighbors Home, an advocacy group of Tapestry Unitarian Universalist Congregation in Lake Forest. As concerned citizens, we work to serve and advocate for people who are homeless and those at risk of losing their home, and for those with low incomes who live and work in our communities.

I support the Villages development, but ONLY if it includes homes that are affordable to the many lower income residents and workers in Laguna Hills.

To set the stage, to qualify for the low income and moderate income homes at the Villages, income targets are about \$71,000 for a single person, \$82,000 for a household of two and \$103,000 for a family of four.

Why is this concerning? Because these salary targets exclude many Laguna Hills residents and workers to be hired in the Villages.

The consultant's Fiscal Impact Analysis shows creation of 2,900 on-site jobs, with a \$43,000 average salary. About half of these jobs created on-site, will be restaurant, hotel and retail workers—not income qualified for the "affordable" homes being built.

In addition, the Laguna Hills Staff Report names these low wage jobs as eligible for the Village's affordable housing: Nurse: \$54,000, Office clerk \$33,000, Retail worker \$25,000 and waiter/waitress \$25,000—all very low income workers.

Based on Income Limits, clearly most of the permanent jobs identified in these two reports will NOT qualify these employees for the housing proposed low income and moderate income classifications

Currently 23% of Laguna Hills households earn less than \$50,000 per year [1] 37% earn less than \$75,000.

In 2014 city planning staff noted need and requests for low-income affordable housing, especially for seniors, families, low wage workers, and those who have physical impairments. Suitable housing for these groups has not been built in many, many years.

I believe it is critical for the City Council to create housing opportunities for the full range of its constituents, especially those who have been under-represented or not well-served in the past.

Thank you for your time, and for your important service to all the residents of this city.

Dear Mayor Pezold and Councilmembers:

I write in support of the Village at Laguna Hills project. As a former 18-year member of the city council (5 of those years as mayor), I am writing to provide my perspective on the project, the staff report and recommendations and the Development Agreement (DA). I understand that a number of concerns have been raised by the public.

Consistency with the Urban Village Specific Plan as Modified (UVSP):

I was on the council in 2002 when the UVSP was adopted. I was also on the council in 2009 when the General Plan was updated and in 2011 when the UVSP was modified. The UVSP was essentially an invitation to redevelop the mall and surrounding property including Oakbrook Village. It was a concern of the council that the mall and surrounding areas were declining. As major assets to the city, it was thought that some incentive was needed to prompt action by the owners. Other than the trip count, the uses in the UVSP were not fixed intentionally to give the owners flexibility. Oakbrook took advantage of the council's vision and has redeveloped its site. I personally had meetings, along with the city manager, with the owner of the mall (Simon Companies) to encourage it to submit a plan. Unfortunately, Simon did not take advantage of the opportunity and the council's concerns regarding the viability of the mall have come to fruition. The specific uses in the original and the modified UVSP were never meant to be a cap on any type of use. Such a cap would have been counter to the goals of the council. Staff's analysis of this issue is absolutely accurate.

CEQA

I have also heard that concerns have been raised about the use of addendums to the PEIR for compliance with CEQA. This concern is unfounded. This process has been successfully used four times without challenge. The consultants and the city attorney are on solid ground in the use of this procedure. I speak not only as a former councilmember but as a practicing attorney for fifty years. I have attached my resume for your review.

Development Agreement

There should be no concerns about the DA. It is a well written document which provides benefits and obligations to both parties as do all negotiated agreements. In order to provide certainty to the owner it vests entitlement rights in exchange for concessions in favor of the city. Those benefits include \$26 million dollars to the city. Over 2.2 million in community benefit payments for loss of sales tax and 18 million in nonrefundable and guaranteed park fees. The agreement provides for the timing of development, a hotel, affordable housing and substantial additional public benefits as described on pages 79- 84 of the April 27, 2021 staff report and sections 7 through 10 of the DA. Although the city has lost sales tax revenue, the owner has also had little to no return on its substantial investment in the property. Yet the owner in exchange for entitlements has agreed to considerable financial concessions to the city.

Disapproval

What happens if the project and DA are not approved? In that, hopefully, unlikely event, the city will most likely be subject to costly litigation from a variety of sources including the state of California. Since there would be no development agreement, the benefits as described in the staff report and Development Agreement would be lost. Loss of the Development Agreement would have severe financial consequences for the City. Disapproval would result in either a blighted area or a use (such as entirely residential) inconsistent with the mixed-use concept developed long ago. I am confident the council will not take this disastrous route.

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

Good evening, members of the City Council. I am Denise Fleury, with Welcoming Neighbors Home, an advocacy group of Tapestry Unitarian Universalist Congregation in Lake Forest. As concerned citizens, we work to serve and advocate for people who are homeless and those at risk of losing their home, and for those with low incomes who live and work in our communities.

I support the Villages development, but ONLY if it includes homes that are affordable to the many lower income residents and workers in Laguna Hills.

To set the stage, to qualify for the low income and moderate income homes at the Villages, income targets are about \$71,000 for a single person, \$82,000 for a household of two and \$103,000 for a family of four.

Why is this concerning? Because these salary targets exclude many Laguna Hills residents and workers to be hired in the Villages.

The consultant's Fiscal Impact Analysis shows creation of 2,900 on-site jobs, with a \$43,000 average salary. About half of these jobs created on-site, will be restaurant, hotel and retail workers—not income qualified for the "affordable" homes being built.

In addition, the Laguna Hills Staff Report names these low wage jobs as eligible for the Village's affordable housing: Nurse: \$54,000, Office clerk \$33,000, Retail worker \$25,000 and waiter/waitress \$25,000—all very low income workers.

Based on Income Limits, clearly most of the permanent jobs identified in these two reports will NOT qualify these employees for the housing proposed low income and moderate income classifications

Currently 23% of Laguna Hills households earn less than \$50,000 per year 37% earn less than \$75,000.

In 2014 city planning staff noted need and requests for low-income affordable housing, especially for seniors, families, low wage workers, and those who have physical impairments. Suitable housing for these groups has not been built in many, many years.

I believe it is critical for the City Council to create housing opportunities for the full range of its constituents, especially those who have been under-represented or not well-served in the past.

Thank you for your time, and for your important service to all the residents of this city.

Since the hearing regarding the Village at Laguna Hills, our volunteers have done some additional research to learn what the availability and cost of apartments is - in Laguna Hills and in nearby cities. The following data further shows the housing affordability crisis in Laguna Hills and exemplifies why it is important to prioritize Affordable Housing for our lower income residents and workforce. This is a critical site for the city to meet its low and very low-income RHNA goals.

For context, the California Office of Housing and Community Development **rental limit for a 4 person very low-income household** in Orange County (yearly income \$67,250), is **\$1,391 per month**. (See chart below for details about income and rental limits for various income categories.)

Our research determined that for the Reata and SOFI, the two apartment complexes nearest the Village, the monthly rent for a 1-bedroom is \$1,954 to \$2,000. It is \$2,800 for a 2 bedroom.

Besides Rancho Niguel and Rancho Moulton, the only two apartment complexes in Laguna Hills that take Section 8 vouchers, the *lowest rents* in the area were \$1,800 for a 1 bedroom and \$2,050 for a 2-bedroom. Many places had higher rents – more typically in the range of \$2k to \$3k per month. (See the below chart for rental data.)

The two apartments that take <u>Section 8 had no vacancies</u>. In talking to the manager of the Rancho Niguel apartments, we learned they are not adding names to the <u>waitlist because it's already 5 to 10 years long</u>. (Similarly, for other low income apartments that take Section 8 vouchers, waitlists were closed or several years long.)

As you can see, there is a mis-match between what people can afford and the availability of housing options in and near Laguna Hills. This is why we ask that you require Merlone Geier to include 15% of the housing units in the Village at rental rates that will be affordable to those in the <u>very low and extremely low-income categories</u>, i.e., incomes that are under \$50,000 and under \$30,000 per year.

We write to share and clarify information and context regarding:

- 1. The Staff Report "Neighborhood Outreach" section in the April 27, 2021 City Council Meeting that refers to the community grassroot group Future of Laguna Hills Advisory Group (FLAG) (p. 85)
- 2. Fiscal Impact Study

STAFF REPORT

The report states:

"Around the same time that the Applicant was considering an update to the 2016 Five Lagunas approval, a community organization known as the Future of Laguna Hills Advisory Group, or FLAG for short, was created. The goals of FLAG, as stated in their official Facebook page, are to 'Be a community advocate that seeks to engage community participation in processes and decisions that shape the future of the City of Laguna Hills' and 'Establish a healthy partnership and identify needs of community stakeholders, such as the City of Laguna Hills, its residents and businesses, land owners and developers, and more, to foster innovative thinking that creates a win-win for all parties' To that end, the Applicant has had ongoing dialogue and met at least twice with FLAG throughout the entitlement process. The previous City Manager met with FLAG four times, City Staff has had multiple discussions with FLAG throughout the entitlement process and the Interim City Manager has invited FLAG for a meeting to review the current Project proposal. Furthermore, when FLAG submitted to the City Council an extensive list of frequently asked questions, Staff provided answers to each question and posted the FAQs on the City website in order to provide greater transparency about the planning process and procedures. As of April 1, 2021, the Project's webpage has had over 6,200 unique views since November 2019."

For clarification, while FLAG communicates with staff regularly, has met with the previous city manager on occasion, two of which were with the Applicant, and was invited by the city interim manager to revie the current proposal, FLAG has not had "ongoing dialogue" with Merlone Geier Partners ("MGP" / "Applicant").

- In July 2019, FLAG met with previous City Manager and the Applicant. It was agreed that Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) be prepared for the community and that a possible survey be considered. The Applicant created a survey which they made available online. FAQs provided by Applicant were geared toward project history and not the development planning process. So, FLAG and City Staff collaborated on community questions that both parties had received. These were presented those to City Council, and City Staff provided answers to those questions, which were subsequently posted on the City's website late 2019/early 2020. FLAG provided a link to the community for those FAQs.
- In October 2019, FLAG receive invitation and accepted a met with previous City Manager and the Applicant.
 The Applicant showed FLAG a preview of its new plan for mixed-use commercial and high-density
 apartment unit development. FLAG did not opine on the matter as the Applicant was set to present plan to
 City Council days later in November 2019. FLAG notified the community of the City Council meeting. Many
 community members communicated 1,200-1,500 apartment units were too many and to scale back to the
 988 approved in 2016.
- In February 2020, FLAG spoke at City Council Meeting about the proposed mixed-use and high-density apartment unit proposed development. With regards to the former Laguna Hills mall property, our community seemed to understand there will be some level of dwelling units; however, that the 1,200-1,500 rental

apartment units proposed was unacceptable. FLAG continued to actively seek community responses and ideas and encouraged the community share their thoughts with the City. The following week, FLAG was notified by the previous City Manager that the Applicant had solidified their plan with 1,500 apartment units and other areas of their proposed mixed-use development. It was FLAG's understanding from the former City Manager that the Applicant was not willing to discuss further changes to the proposal.

- In September 2020, the previous City Manager invited FLAG to meet with the Applicant for a project update.
 However, while FLAG agreed to meet with the previous City Manager, it declined to meet with the Applicant
 as it was our understanding there was no room to discuss changes. We responded, "While we hoped our
 community's concerns would be heard and responded to by MGP... At this time... [w]e humbly suggest
 MGP address our entire community and City Council publicly and transparently." FLAG provided community
 member with an update of the meeting. (attached)
- In October 2020, the Applicant directly emailed FLAG to discuss the project and that they were hosting virtual forums. *The Applicant had not directly contacted FLAG since July 2019 (14 months)*.
 - FLAG's responded, "FLAG, of course, wants and expects to be part of continued conversations. However, it's FLAG's understanding that there is no room for further discussion on suggestions or changes to MGP's proposed application/plan. If this is true, at this time, FLAG representatives are uncertain of the value a meeting would have."
 - The Applicant responded, "We are always looking for further suggestions and suggested changes. As part of our CEQA documents we have studied the most intense uses for environmental review. We believe the plans that been submitted for review suggests what we believe is market driven with the retail, housing, office and hotel. We strongly believe the plans being reviewed by the city is financially beneficial for the city moving forward for years to come."
 - FLAG responded, "With regards to a special zoom interactive meeting with FLAG, separate from community forums, let's see how your Virtual Forum goes. "We would hope that MGP would explain to the greater community why, according to MGP, the overall plan works for the long-term viability of the community and real estate MGP should be responsible for directly articulating any benefits to the community."
 - FLAG made recommendations for the Applicant's virtual forums and agreed to spread the
 word about them. The Applicant stated they would record and make available recordings of
 the virtual forums and that they would work on getting answers to questions posted after
 those meetings for the public to review and that FLAG would be added to their distribution
 list.
 - Since interacting in October 2020, FLAG has not heard from the Applicant. FLAG has not received from the Applicant information regarding recorded forums, information for the posting of community questions and answers, communication from its distributions lists, etc.
- In March 2021, FLAG did see/receive a sponsored social media communication on Facebook promoting the project.
 - Post: www.facebook.com/villageatlagunahills/posts/263184938686869
 - Solicitation to email City Council's support: www.bit.ly/ApproveVillage
 - FLAG's response:
 - As involved and active community members, we find Merlone Geier Partners'
 approach to the redevelopment of this property very unfortunate, instead of
 working WITH the community on the front-end of this proposed project, MGP has
 elected to put forth a paid for/sponsored Facebook ad on the back-end to gain
 community support.
 - Per the form letter being marketing via this link, MGP states:
 - "Concern about the Village at Laguna Hills seem pretty manageable: Residential Unit Density – 50 per acre."
 - Why not say what it is... 1,500 apartments?
 - The community repeatedly asked MGP scale back the proposed 1,500 apartments and that it considers, in part, housing that promotes ownership of

one's dwelling vs renting, which over the "next 20-30 years" of this development would produce more property tax revenue for our city.

- We truly wanted to believe in MGP when they said they pride themselves on working with the community. Our community has been failed.

 March 24, 2021, Ken Rosenfield, interim city manager, reached out to FLAG to invite us for an update on the Village at Laguna Hills project late March/early April. While it was understood this was in the spirit of continuing what the previous City Manager's outreach included, FLAG responded:

"Thank you for reaching out to us and offering a Village at Laguna Hills update. We greatly value our relationship with City Staff and City Councilmembers.

A gentle reminder; FLAG is a community advocate. We formed to engage community participation in processes and decisions that shape the future of our city. We do not speak for the community. There are many concerned stakeholders, such as our Laguna Hills' residents and businesses, who have been waiting a long time for an update.

Because of this, we respectfully ask that the development proposal update on the Village at Laguna Hills be made/given to all stakeholders. We also suggest the city provide an agenda pre meeting and an executive summary post meeting. This will lend transparency to the city actions and help all interested parties know what is to be covered and what was covered in the update.

As we are still in a declared pandemic, in addition to allowing those who would like to attend in person while socially distanced with masks, we suggest modern methods of communication are made available (e.g., video conference, Zoom, etc.). We appreciate your recommendation on this and how it might best be accomplished.

We are willing to help the city communicate specifics of the update announcement to our members and community and ask that the city also post the announcement on its website and email all those who have requested notification updates regarding the development."

- From this communication, FLAG learned that 1) two-way video conference would/could not be
 made available for a variety of reasons, and 2) updates to the greater community would happen
 through an official Public Hearing, and that if community members wanted to be heard they could
 email comments or show up in person to the meeting.
- April 5, 2021 FLAG received notice from Jay Wuu, Senior Planner, there a Public Hearing on April 27, 2021.
 FLAG communication to community members the notice of the Public Hearing.

With regards to the Village at Laguna Hills proposed development, FLAG has shared its opinions and concerns about the mixed-use and high-density rental apartment development with City Council, City Staff, and the Applicant, and it has encouraged the greater community to directly reach out as well.

- 2) We hope you have delved into about the Fiscal Impact Study for this proposed development. **The report seems to assume full building through Phase III**. (Attached is the report with highlight and note within those highlights.)

In closing, we appreciate and value companies investing in our community. It's ideal they have a return on their investment that achieves or exceeds their goals. However, their goals must be met in a way that meets the City of Laguna Hills' long-term needs and goals, which, must include the long-term greater good and betterment of the surrounding existing and future communities, including but not limited to financial stability (including unrestricted general fund and not being primarily reliant on one-time restricted-use QUIMBY fees), which supports our city's ability to provide better outcomes for city's public safety, much needed maintenance, residents, businesses, schools, city beautification, and infrastructure, to name a few.

Not in My Back Yard," is a grossly overused buzzword. This is not about NIMBY. This is about 1) how and when does quality of life matter and 2) how and when does the long-term greater good of our community matter?

Earlier this month, the City Manager invited FLAG representatives to meet for an update on the proposed development for The Village of Laguna Hills. We accepted a meeting with the City Manager but declined Merlone Geier Partners' (MGP) participation because our understanding is MGP has no intent of discussing changes to the proposed development.

Throughout this process, we have shared with the City Manager and City Council, that MGP should provide updates to the community about the proposed development by actively and directly 1) reaching out to our community and 2) addressing our community and City Council publicly and transparently.

You, our Laguna Hills community, must reach out to City Council. Let your opinions, concerns, and questions be known.

SUMMARY: MGP Development Application/Plan Update Meeting

FLAG representatives met with Don White, city manager, and Greg Simonian, city attorney, Wednesday, October 7, 2020 for an update on proposed development for The Village of Laguna Hills.

It is our understanding the City Manager has briefed some individual City Council Members with an update and that MGP was present to make a brief presentation and answer questions.

Development Application/Plan

MGP is proceeding with its application for 1,500 apartment dwell units with mixed-use of retail/restaurants, fitness center, cinema, hotel, park, and offices. Per the City Manager and City Attorney, the proposed development application/plan adheres to current zoning laws/requirements.

Currently, the City and MGP are negotiating a Development Agreement. This agreement has to be mutually entered into and agreed upon by both parties. According to the City, this agreement gives the City and the Developer assurances and guarantees, and these agreements typically cover a 15-year period.

Project Review and Public Hearing

Once the proposed development application is deemed complete and the Development Agreement, Environmental Impact Report/Addendum, and Net Fiscal Impact Study are finalized, all items will be available for City Council and Public/Community review. At this time, City Staff cannot say with certainty when

these items will be released. When they are released, there will be, at least, a 21-day review period.

Notification for a public hearing must be given 21 days in advance, and it must be scheduled at a regularly scheduled City Council Meeting (translation = a special meeting cannot be called for a public hearing). City Council meetings are scheduled on the 2nd and 4th Tuesday each month. Such a public hearing usually takes place at one meeting where the City Council will decide to approve or turn down the development application/plan.

Notification of Public Hearing

The City is only required to notify properties within 300 feet of the proposed project about the public hearing. If you want to be notified about the public hearing, you must email Jay Wuu, Senior Planner at jwuu@lagunahillsca.gov and ensure you receive confirmation of receipt.

Kosmont & Associates, Inc. doing business as Kosmont Companies ("Consultant" or "Kosmont") is pleased to transmit this Updated Fiscal Impact Analysis for Merlone Geier Partners ("MGP") proposed Village at Laguna Hills ("Project") to the City of Laguna Hills ("City"). The Project is located at the southwest corner of El Toro Road and I-405 Freeway in Laguna Hills, California.

Background

As part of the entitlement and development agreement negotiations process with MGP, the City requested an analysis to evaluate the fiscal impact of the most recent Project master plan.

As a result of the tremendous challenges facing department stores and retail malls, the current Project plan and CEQA clearance calls for a new concept with a blend of uses with a maximum of 1,500 apartments, 250,000 SF of retail/entertainment/fitness, 150-room hotel and 465,000 SF of office. The proposed improvements are further described in the report.

Analysis Description

This analysis evaluates the stabilized annual fiscal revenues and expenditures expected for the City's General Fund. Fiscal revenues were derived from estimating the various taxes associated with the Project including property taxes (secured and unsecured), business taxes, franchise taxes, direct and indirect sales taxes, and transient occupancy taxes. Liscal expenditures such as public safety were estimated on a per capita basis using the City's Fiscal Year 2020-2021 Adopted Budget, and the resident population within the City. An IMPLAN econometric model was utilized to estimate direct, indirect, and induced economic benefits (jobs, wages, output) resulting from the construction and operations within the Project.

With a blend of uses, the Project will provide significant tax revenues from a variety of sources, rather than concentration of sales taxes that is ubject to significant economic cycles. This diversification will protect the City general fund from future economic downturns.

Economic Impact

This Analysis uses the IMPLAN (IMpact analysis for PLANning) econometric input/output model developed by the IMPLAN Group to quantify the economic impact to the local region from full Project construction and ongoing operations. Table 2.3 shows over 7,000 fulltime equivalent jobs, \$507 million in labor income and \$1.2 billion in total County economic output from the multi-year construction period. In addition to the direct on-site spending, the City will benefit from a fair share of the indirect and induced spending.

Other Benefits

In addition to the General Fund revenues and local job creation, the Project will provide other indirect benefits such as increased State and County Highway funds (Measure M and SB 1) that are partially distributed based on population. The formula is very complex, but Kosmont estimates it could be over \$10,000 per year based on the projected growth in population.

The addition of 1,500 apartment units will help the City meet almost half of the State Regional Housing Needs Assessment allocation.

3.0 Development Plan

The Project master plan envisions an approximately 2.7 million SF mixed/blended-use development and is designed for multiple phases to be built over the next 20 years.

Given the uncertainty of actual development timing and future inflation rates for revenues and expenses, commont has focused this analysis on the estimated annual revenues and expenses at full buildout in 2020\$.

Development Costs

Project development costs at full buildout are estimated at \$781 million, which will drive assessed value for property tax purposes.

As shown in Table 3.1 the apartment units represent approximately 60% of the total development budget, with the office component representing a little over 20%.

4.0 Fiscal Impacts

This Analysis is based on Information provided by MGP and their subconsultants, City, Orange County ("County") Property Tax Auditor-Controller's Office, California Department of Finance ("DOF"), California Board of Equalization ("BOE"), and ESRI.

4.1 General Assumptions

General assumptions follow:

- Dollar amounts are expressed in 2020 dollars.
- 2 verage 1.42 residents per household
- Fiscal impacts are estimated at stabilized occupancy.

4.2 Fiscal Revenue Analysis

4.2.1 Property Tax

Secured property tax revenues are estimated based on the anticipated assessed value of the Project upon full build-out and the applicable property tax rates for the City. The City General Fund receives 9% of the annual 1.0% secured property tax general levy placed by the County on the assessed value of the property in this Tax Rate Area. Based on the estimated development budget of \$781 million, less a 5% adjustment factor, the Project is estimated to generate \$701,000 in annual property taxes as shown below.

4.2.4 Sales Tax (Off-Site / Indirect)

Off-site / indirect sales tax revenue projections are estimated based on the taxable sales generated by the spending of Project residents and employees, off-site, within the City. Resident spending is based on average household incomes and BLS Consumer Expenditure Survey data, which provides spending habits of consumers based on average household income.

Based on the Project's location, the Analysis assumes 50% Citywide capture rate for annual resident spending and 30% City capture rates for employee spending. Because the residents will spend a substantial portion of disposable income within the Project, Kosmont assumed a 15% reduction factor to avoid double counting the incremental taxable sales.

At full buildout, the total annual off-site sales tax revenue is estimated at \$310,000 as shown in Table 4.2.4 on the following page.

4.2.5 Transient Occupancy Tax ("TOT")

Transient Occupancy Tax revenues are projected based on estimated average daily room rates (ADR), occupancy, and the City's TOT rate of 10%. The CEQA analysis assumes a 150-room hotel. With ADR of \$170 and average occupancy of 72%, the estimated annual TOT is \$670,000.

4.2.6 Recreation Fees

The City generates \$870,000 per year in recreation fees from local residents, which equates to \$26.69 per resident times 2,020 residents at stabilized occupancy results in incremental increase of \$54,000 per year.

4.2.7 Franchise Taxes

The City generates \$1,260,000 in utility transfer taxes and waste disposal fees, which equates to \$30.66 per resident-equivalent times 4,330 resident-equivalents results in incremental increase of \$107,000 at full buildout.

4.3 Fiscal Expenditure Analysis

Expenditures such as public safety and other fiscal expenditures are estimated based on data from the City's Fiscal Year 2020-2021 Adopted Budget, as well as interviews with each department head to ascertain the fixed and variable components of their departmental budget in order to estimate the cost impact of the new residents.

1 ublic Safety

Public safety, which includes police, fire, animal control and emergency management, is the largest budget item, at \$8.9 million, representing approximately 40% of total expenditures. Based on recommendations from the Police Chief, the incremental increase in County contract for public safety costs assumes a full patrol squad of 4 officers and required equipment, with a total annual cost of \$1,501,100.

Public Services Costs

Public services, which includes engineering, public works and parks, is the second largest budget category at \$4.8 million. Because the vast majority of those costs are fixed, the incremental increase is estimated at \$114,700.

Community Development

Community Development includes Building and Planning. The annual costs total \$1.46 million. Because all of those costs are fixed or unrelated to new residential population, the incremental increase is estimated to be negligible.

Community Services

Community Services includes recreation, solid waste and recycling. These costs total \$2.2 million. Because the vast majority of those costs are fixed, the incremental increase is estimated at \$21,400.

General Government & Non-Departmental

General government (City Manager, City Clerk, City Attorney, Finance and Administrative Services) and Non-Departmental (Citywide functions such as information technology) cost is \$4.0 million per year. Because the vast majority of those costs are fixed, the incremental increase is estimated at \$33,100 for General Government and \$15,000 for Non-Departmental.

In summary, at full buildout the Project will result in total annual allocated municipal service costs estimated at \$1.69 million in 2020\$, as shown in Exhibit 4.4 on following page.

4.4 Net Fiscal Analysis

As shown in Exhibit 4.4, the Project is expected to generate gross annual revenue of approximately \$2,992,000 at full buildout. After estimated general fund expenditures of \$1,685,000, the net fiscal impact is projected to be **\$1,307,000 per year**.

The major contributors to City revenues are onsite and offsite sales tax with 39% of the total, followed by property tax and In Lieu of VLF at 34%, and then hotel TOT at 22% of total. The major factor increasing future municipal service costs is expected to be public safety.

Earlier this month, the City Manager invited FLAG representatives to meet for an update on the proposed development for The Village of Laguna Hills. We accepted a meeting with the City Manager but declined Merlone Geier Partners' (MGP) participation because our understanding is MGP has no intent of discussing changes to the proposed development.

Throughout this process, we have shared with the City Manager and City Council, that MGP should provide updates to the community about the proposed development by actively and directly 1) reaching out to our community and 2) addressing our community and City Council publicly and transparently.

You, our Laguna Hills community, must reach out to City Council. Let your opinions, concerns, and questions be known.

SUMMARY: MGP Development Application/Plan Update Meeting

FLAG representatives met with Don White, city manager, and Greg Simonian, city attorney, Wednesday, October 7, 2020 for an update on proposed development for The Village of Laguna Hills.

It is our understanding the City Manager has briefed some individual City Council Members with an update and that MGP was present to make a brief presentation and answer questions.

Development Application/Plan

MGP is proceeding with its application for 1,500 apartment dwell units with mixed-use of retail/restaurants, fitness center, cinema, hotel, park, and offices. Per the City Manager and City Attorney, the proposed development application/plan adheres to current zoning laws/requirements.

Currently, the City and MGP are negotiating a Development Agreement. This agreement has to be mutually entered into and agreed upon by both parties. According to the City, this agreement gives the City and the Developer assurances and guarantees, and these agreements typically cover a 15-year period.

Project Review and Public Hearing

Once the proposed development application is deemed complete and the Development Agreement, Environmental Impact Report/Addendum, and Net Fiscal Impact Study are finalized, all items will be available for City Council and Public/Community review. At this time, City Staff cannot say with certainty when

these items will be released. When they are released, there will be, at least, a 21-day review period.

Notification for a public hearing must be given 21 days in advance, and it must be scheduled at a regularly scheduled City Council Meeting (translation = a special meeting cannot be called for a public hearing). City Council meetings are scheduled on the 2nd and 4th Tuesday each month. Such a public hearing usually takes place at one meeting where the City Council will decide to approve or turn down the development application/plan.

Notification of Public Hearing

The City is only required to notify properties within 300 feet of the proposed project about the public hearing. If you want to be notified about the public hearing, you must email Jay Wuu, Senior Planner at jwuu@lagunahillsca.gov and ensure you receive confirmation of receipt.

Using an agile mindset, 7 - 10 years from now the market, how we work, etc. will be changed. The generations at work have made it clear what is of interest to them and what is not of interest to them.

When it comes to work, the majority of employees, recently polled around the country, would forgo a \$30,000 raise to go back to the office vs. work from home. Work from home is going to be the future, as is telehealth and other ways technology changes the way we work. A hybrid workforce will continue to be the future for almost all industries. Some companies are now saying, they do not need large office complexes or buildings. Just one place where people may be able to come to the office for meetings and then go home. Just use a portable stage. You can also have an outdoor movie afternoon or evening. Many communities already have and it is very successful.

The generation that will be in the workforce by 2030/2031 is called the Alpha Generation. They were born starting in 2010. Their nickname is "screenagers". They too will have an impact on the future of how we shop, etc.

Will these new developments be smoke free, or will there be sections that are smoke free? Smoking is being considered a nuisance today and lawsuits are starting to pop up.

Restaurants and retail would be ideal, although retail is changing. More restaurants are needed, as are other venues. The newer generations, prefer to shop online. Planning for the future now is critical, or will we have another place where very few, if any will come. Depending on how we build this community today, may become an eyesore of the future. Plan well, using an agile mindset.
