STAY INFORMED

- Secure doors and windows with strong locks, and consider a security system or motionsensor lights.
- Use fire-resistant lights and avoid overloading outlets.
- Keep candles away from flammable items and never leave them unattended.
- Stay alert when cooking and have a fire extinguisher nearby.
- If you're traveling, ask a trusted neighbor to keep an eye on your home and use timers to make lights turn on and off.
- Hide gifts and valuables so they're not visible from outside.

REMAIN READY DURING THE HOLIDAY RUSH BE SAFE, DRIVE SAFE.

The holiday season is here, bringing colder weather and increased traffic. Thanksgiving is the busiest travel holiday and leads to significant road congestion, and "Black Friday" shopping adds to the chaos. To keep everyone safe from Thanksgiving to Christmas, read the driver safety tips below and have a stress-free festive season.

ROAD SAFETY TIPS

To ensure your safety during holiday travel season, you must be prepared for a variety of weather situations. Begin by checking forecasts before leaving, and keep up with any changes. If you expect rain or snow, consider utilizing winter tires for better grip, and brush up on your driving abilities to manage slick roads safely.

In the event of an emergency, remain calm and evaluate the situation. If feasible, move your vehicle to the side of the road and utilize your hazard lights, since it is typically safer to stay inside your vehicle during bad conditions until help arrives. Use your phone wisely while calling for help, but avoid distractions while driving.

Additionally, traveling with a companion can provide added safety and support. Be mindful not to overload your vehicle, as this can affect handling and braking. Finally, stay informed by keeping up with local news and traffic updates regarding emergencies or hazardous road conditions. Being prepared may make a big difference in ensuring a safe winter trip.

EMERGENCY ROAD SAFETY KIT

- ☐ Spare tire, wheel wrench and tripod jack
- Jumper cables
- ☐ Tool kit and/or a multipurpose utility tool
- ☐ Flashlight and extra batteries
- Reflective triangles and brightly colored cloth to make your vehicle more visible
- ☐ First aid kit
- Nonperishable high-energy food
- Drinking water
- Reflective vest in case you need to walk to get help
- Car charger for your cell phone
- ☐ Fire extinguisher
- ☐ Duct tape
- ☐ Windshield washer fluid
- Warm clothing
 - Blankets

REMEMBER - REGISTER FOR A VACATION CHECK!

Laguna Hills Police Services provides patrol checks of your home while you are away on vacation or business. Submit the Vacation Patrol Check Form a week prior to your travel date (form available online).

- Email the completed Vacation Patrol Check Form to Crimeprevention@lagunahillsCA.gov
- Contact Laguna Hills Police Services for any questions regarding the matter.

HOW TO REPORT A CRIME

Orange County Sheriff Dispatchers need to have accurate information as quickly as possible about any suspicious activity or crimes in progress.

When you call dispatch:

- Give your name, address, and telephone callback number.
- Describe the event that you are reporting in a brief manner.
- If you have footage of the incident, inform the dispatcher.
- Where, When, How, Why, and Who did it?
- Describe the subject as best as possible.
- Sex, race, age, height, weight, hair color/style, facial hair, tattoos, clothing, and demeanor.
- Describe the vehicle if one was involved and the direction of travel (if the vehicle is moving).
- Color, make, model, style (4-door/2-door), year, license plate, dents, or special markings such as stickers.
- Stay on the line until the Dispatch Operator advises that they have all the information that is needed.
- Remain Calm.

QUICK TIP

REPORTING AN INCIDENT OR A CRIME?

For quick reporting of suspicious activity, make sure to save the non-emergency number: (949) 770-6011. This connects you directly to Orange County Sheriff's Dispatch, allowing you to report incidents efficiently without tying up emergency lines.

Important: If you're witnessing a crime in progress or face an immediate threat, always call 9-1-1.

HOT CALL HIGHLIGHTS

OCTOBER 22, 2024
