- Stock Essentials: Bottled water, non-perishable foods, medications, flashlights, and batteries that can last for at least 72 hours.

For quick reporting of suspicious activity, make sure to save the non-emergency number: (949) 770-6011. This connects you directly to Orange County Sheriff's Dispatch, allowing you to report incidents efficiently without tying up emergency lines.

Important: If you're witnessing a crime in progress or face an immediate threat, always call 9-1-1.
