

#### New Fire Hazard Severity Zone Maps Released

On March 24, Cal Fire unveiled updated fire hazard severity zone maps encompassing Laguna Hills and the entire state of California. These 2025 Local Responsibility Area (LRA) Fire Hazard Severity Maps categorize regions into very high, high, or moderate fire hazard zones using the latest climate data, historical fire incidents, terrain characteristics, and wildfire modeling. These maps play a critical role in revising our building codes, defensible space requirements, and overall fire safety policies. While they do not indicate immediate fire risk, they inform



local strategies for wildfire prevention and mitigation.

The City of Laguna Hills is mandated to adopt a finalized map and ordinance within 120 days to comply with state regulations. Although the city cannot downgrade wildfire severity zones designated by Cal Fire, it reserves the option to elevate hazard levels based on local risk assessments. A public hearing by the City Council will be scheduled to review the map and welcome community feedback.

As we get ready to dive into warmer weather, familiarize yourself with water safety tips from the OCFA:

## ABC's OF WATER SAFETY



Water safety starts at home. Keeping yourself and others safe in and around the water is as easy as ABC. Follow the safety tips below to make sure you know how to be water safe!



Children and adults drown without a sound. No one should ever swim alone.

#### A is for ACTIVE ADULT SUPERVISION

- Keep infants and toddlers within an arm's reach.
- · No one should ever swim alone, including adults.
- Never rely on water wings, rafts, or other swimming aids in place of U.S. Coast Guard approved life jackets.
- Assign an adult to be a Water Watcher, actively keeping their eyes on the water without ANY distractions.
- If a child or adult is missing, every second counts! Check the water FIRST!

#### B is for BARRIERS

- Install and maintain proper fencing around the pool and spa to isolate swimming areas.
- Use multiple layers of protection, such as fences, gates, doors, alarms, and safety covers.
- Use self-closing, self-latching gates that open outward and away from the pool.
- Remove items such as chairs or tables that a child could use to climb over a fence.

#### C is for CLASSES

- Learn to swim by taking lessons.
- Learn first aid and CPR. Always keep a phone nearby to call
- Teach children that running, jumping, and pushing others on pool decks is dangerous and can cause injuries. Always enter the pool feet first so you know how deep the water is in that area.

#### **Drain Safety**

- Keep children away from pool and spa drains to avoid entrapment and entanglement.
- Keep long hair tied back and remove dangling items like jewelry or bathing suit ties.
- Install compliant safety drain covers and automatic shut-off pump systems.
- Know where the pool and spa pump switch is and how to turn it off and on.



#### Solid Waste and Recycling

On June 25, 2024, the City Council awarded a new solid waste and recycling contract to CR&R following a competitive bidding process. Starting July 1, 2025, CR&R will begin providing enhanced services, including new collection vehicles and containers. To prepare, all residents will receive new trash, recycling, and organics containers beginning in February

2025, with the full exchange completed by April 2025. Container swaps will occur on your regular service day. For specific dates and details on when your neighborhood will receive new containers or for more information about services, visit the City's Trash & Recycling Services page here. As required by California Senate Bill 1383 and City regulations, all residents must participate in the three-container waste collection system.
