- Leave fireworks to the pros Illegal fireworks can cause injuries and fires.
- Don't drink and drive Plan a sober ride home before you head out.
- Stay hydrated and cool July heat is no joke, especially in big crowds.
- Follow road closures and signs They're there to protect and guide you.
- Report suspicious activity If something feels off, say something.
- Keep an eye on kids Big events can be overwhelming and easy to get lost in.
- Know where your exits are Always have a meeting spot in case you get separated.

- Someone has a firework related injury.
- A fire has started from use of fireworks.
- Someone is handling fireworks recklessly.
- My pet is too anxious
- ANY LIFE-THREATENING EMERGENCY!

DON'T LET A DUI RUIN YOUR 4TH OF JULY

The 4th of July should end with fireworks not flashing red and blue lights. Drinking and driving puts everyone at risk, including yourself, your passengers, and others on the road.

Stay safe with these tips:

- · Plan ahead
 - Designate a sober driver before the party starts.
- Use a rideshare
 - Ride share Apps are cheaper than a DUI.
- See someone trying to drive drunk?
 - Report it immediately!

Remember, buzzed driving is drunk driving.

BE PREPARED, STAY SAFE

Know the Rules: Fireworks are illegal in the City of Laguna Hills. Leave the pyrotechnics to the professionals and attend authorized firework shows nearby.

4TH OF JULY READINESS

The City of Laguna Hills reminds residents that the Independence Day holiday is one of the busiest days of the year for first responders. Whether you're planning a backyard BBQ or heading out to a local event, a little preparation goes a long way toward avoiding emergencies.

STAY HOLIDAY-READY WITH THESE TIPS:


- Grill with Caution: Keep BBQs at least 10 feet from structures. Never leave an open flame unattended, and keep a fire extinguisher nearby.
- Plan for Heat: Stay hydrated and wear sunscreen. Know the signs of heat exhaustion and take breaks in the shade or indoors.
- Protect Pets: Loud noises from fireworks can stress pets. Keep them indoors, create a calming space, and ensure their ID tags are up-to-date.
- Dispose of Charcoal Safely: Never place hot coals in plastic or paper bins. Let ashes cool completely and store them in a metal container.
- Don't Drink and Drive: Plan for a designated driver or use a ride-share service. Increased DUI
 enforcement will be in effect.
- Report Hazards Promptly: If you see smoke, fire, or any suspicious activity, call 9-1-1 immediately.

Preparedness is a shared responsibility. Let's make this 4th of July enjoyable and incident-free for all in Laguna Hills.

Effective January 1, 2024, all Trespass Arrest Authorization Forms (TAAF) must be notarized. If the property/business owner or agent is not present, deputies need a signed and notarized TAAF to take enforcement action.
