## District Elections Update

The City of Laguna Hills, like hundreds of cities and school districts across the state, is making a change in how voters elect its City Council. Beginning in 2026, voters will vote for one City Council Member who lives in their district. This will replace the current system of at-large citywide elections in which voters have the ability to vote for all City Council Members. ## Statewide Special Election


Governor Newsom has issued a proclamation calling for a Statewide Special Election on November 4, 2025 for the purpose of submitting Proposition 50 – Congressional redistricting to the voters of California. The last day to register to vote in this election is October 20, 2025. Vote-By-Mail ballot processing will begin on October 6, 2025 and will continue Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. until the election is certified no later than December 2, 2025. The last day to request a replacement Vote-By-Mail ballot to be mailed is October 28, 2025. The Vote-By-Mail process is open to the public at the Orange County Registrar of Voters' office, 1300 South Grand Avenue, Building C, Santa Ana. The Council Chamber located at the Laguna Hills Civic Center will be a 4-Day Vote Center and will be open from 8:00 a.m.-8:00 p.m. starting on Saturday, November 1st through Monday, November 3rd and will be open from 7:30 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 4th. Ballot drop-off locations will open on October 7, 2025.
